

Another Rescued Child

Yan aged 3.5 years old was found abandoned in the local market a year ago. No one knew who he was, where his relatives were, how long he had been there and even his age had to be estimated by the doctor. Television appeals for any of his family were unsuccessful. He was too young to go into an orphanage so he was placed in a hospital with no facilities for a young child suffering such trauma.

Since then, Yan had been placed into a foster family. Unfortunately, the 'new parents' were not experienced enough to cope with an excitable 3-year-old boy who was always on the move. A week later the social services had to take him back and place him into an orphanage with the older children. This is usually an extreme solution for a child as young as Yan.

Fortunately, the social services knew that the Genesis House established by our charity with its space and experienced foster parents would make an ideal home for Yan. A few days later, the new arrival was stood on a doorstep of the Genesis house ready for his NEW **BEGINNING**.

He is now settling in nicely with the other children and according to our foster parents - is a joy to have!

Slightly delayed due to the political situation at Christmas I made my winter trip to Ukraine once again. Unfortunately, I was unable to go out and feed the street children as usual because of the extreme weather conditions that prevailed in February and an outbreak of flu that had reached epidemic proportions when I arrived and which I later contracted.

Nevertheless, I was able to have a very long meeting with the social worker called Ludmila who is responsible for any children making their home in Genesis House. I was very impressed with this lady.

Later on, she was responsible for finding Yan and processing all the legal documents to enable us to take him. This is the kind of experience and backup our foster parents will need as more children find a home with us.

Our two children Sofia and Anton (4 and 5 year old) are wonderful and are doing all the things young children do, especially getting in mischief. They both attend the village kindergarten making astonishing progress.

## Cold, Cold School...

The small school that

Marina attends with 300

other children from the



village and a local orphanage has had major problems with a very old heating system. When Pat visited the school in February the temperature inside the classrooms was  $+4^{\circ}$ C (should be at least  $+20^{\circ}$ C). All the pupils had to wrap up as if they were going outside but still they attended their lessons and the teachers still gave 100%.

We at New Beginnings called in experts and elected to pay for the repair of the heating when the school closes in May.

For the time being, the heating has been temporary repaired to last until the worst of the cold winter is over. This will give the children attending the school warmth during their studies, which is something they have not experienced this winter.

## Genesis Project - Foster Parents Scheme

Due to the political situation, many of the Government social projects have been suspended. Unfortunately, this includes the foster parents support scheme and the salaries of the social workers. As a result there are now trained and willing foster families ready to take children into their homes but unable to do so due to financial constraints. New Beginnings have elected to pay the salary of our dedicated social worker and to support some newly trained foster parents until the Government re-starts to finances these projects.

By doing this we will be able to place six children taken from street shelters and orphanages into these loving families. This is a start of a **NEW BEGINNING** for the children who have spent most of their young lives in crisis. At last, they will have safe homes and loving parents.

We would again stress that all the foster parents are trained by the local social services and the children are placed with great care. We work together with the social services as partners to change attitudes towards the homeless and institutionalised children. The results we have seen so far have been astounding and we feel that this is the way forward.

## I wish I could live there...

This letter from a young boy living in a state-run Orphanage N 21 has been sent to us by another charity working with the children in Kiev:

...Right on the edge of the city is a place called Genesis house. I have visited there once. It is a nice house with parents. Not like the huge orphanage, I live in at the moment. At Genesis house, there are . . . . .

only a few children and there are house parents! The children get to live there with the same parents all the time.

It's like having a special day every day. I wish I could go there or somewhere like it. It's not at all like the orphanage where there are lots of us and no parents at all.

At Genesis house the children have meals as a family and learn how to do all

sorts of things. There is a play ground outside. Even pets are possible. One of the girls has a cat and there is a snow dog that lives at the house. The children learn games and can play with the house parents. It costs a lot of money to run Genesis house but it's a great place. I wish more of us could go there even if it were just for a short stay...

# Support for Needy Parents

The main objective of our charity is to help the children in crisis – living on the streets or institutions. However, there are children with loving parents who sometimes need our help. Pat was aware of a young boy called Sergey suffering from spina bifida during her visit to the school.

He was undergoing intense medical treatment to which he was responding. Unfortunately, the parents who sacrificed everything for the sake of a few centimetres growth for their son were unable to pay for the final stage of the treatment. New Beginnings funded the required small amount to allow Sergey those few precious life-changing centimetres.
