Dear Friends and supporters, June last year I was diagnosed with breast cancer. This was discovered through a routine mammograph (thank God for this service). My subsequent treatment consisted of two

operations followed by three weeks of Radiotherapy and weeks of routine clinical appointments and tests. I have experienced the usual tiredness after the treatment but otherwise am fine. The medical staff believes that I am now clear and just need follow up tests on a regular basis. My greatest worry during my illness was my inability to fund raise and travel to Ukraine on my annual visit to see our work first hand. As usual when I am worried, I looked to the Lord for help and just prayed.

Their Father is in prison and their Mother has lost her parental rights because of her neglect for her children. These three young people were due to be sent to separate State run Orphanages splitting the family and causing even more trauma in their already troubled lives.



Sasha, our Foster Father stepped in and offered them a home at Genesis House so they could be kept together. These children bring special problems for our Foster Parents. The eldest boy, Vladimir, smokes, swears and is aggressive and being a teenager he is looked on as a role model by the younger children thus causing all their bad behaviour to come to the fore. Fortunately our Foster Parents have so much experience, patience and love to offer that they are able to bring the best out of these children and restore order in Genesis House allowing them all to learn, have fun and live a safe and secure life.

Lydia, our Grandma was reading one of her gardening magazines when she saw an article about a firm of greenhouse suppliers. In the article the Owner of the firm supplying the greenhouses stated that he gave one in every ten

greenhouses sold to an orphanage free of charge. Lydia immediately wrote to the company and told them about Genesis House. She was told that the article she had read was old and they no longer did this. Being a very determined Lady, Lydia went back to the Company and insisted that they do as their advert suggested. She finally persuaded them to provide a greenhouse free of charge and now has it full of plants.

Lydia, with very little help grows all our Vegetables, soft fruit and harvests our fruit Trees to make jams, fruit juice and bottled fruits. With

help from the children and Foster Parents, she bottles and stores all the produce for the winter. Anything surplus during the growing season is taken to feed the young people in the Borispol Disabled Centre. Lydia's efforts contribute the greater part of our food budget making us almost self sustainable. She is a much valued member of the team running Genesis House.

Genesis House Needs

Due to our family now consisting of older children with different needs, we find we need to provide a few more adult type recreational items. Also some of our equipment is now getting old and is coming up for replacement.

We are looking for help trying to achieve these necessary items and on our wish list at present we have a pool table, bookcases, and a replacement fridge and washing machine. Our old minibus is also ready for replacement but we just need to keep it running so if anyone would like to sponsor anything at all towards the cost of these items and repairs, it would be graciously received and allow us to continue supporting "Children in Crisis"

Letter from Valentina

Dear Friends.

I would like to tell you a story about a boy called Sergei Solavanuk, born in 1999. He came to our disabled rehabilitation centre in 2008 and to the amazement of all our staff he was so pale and



thin as if he was transparent. All you could see was his frightened smile and sad dark eyes. Aged 8, Sergei could not speak at all, was not able to listen to anyone, and was very jumpy and constantly tried to escape like a frightened animal. Sergei's mother did not want anything to do with her disabled son, so he was being looked after by his Grandfather.

We were all a bit bemused and were even going to refuse him a place in our centre as we have no facilities for such children, but then we felt so sorry for him and decided to take him. Eventually we managed to accommodate his needs with an individual care regime. We were also able to advise Sergei's Grandfather on how to obtain disability status for his grandson. At the same time we approached the social services who confronted Sergei's Mother. They explained that she would lose her parental rights if she carried on like this. Since then she has got a job and is really starting to care about her son and give some financial aid to the Grandfather.

That is when the real transformation began! We taught Sergei to feed himself, before he would push all the food down his throat without chewing and make himself sick, or eat too much and end up getting stomach cramps. We also cured his head lice problem, and scabies.



Eventually, after a lot of hard work our specialists (paid for by New Beginnings) were able to make great progress with Sergei's development. He is now able to speak many words, he understands their meaning. He can hold a pencil and colour in pictures, make clay figures and all this is done while sitting down, not jumping as before or running. Now Sergei can speak in sentences, he has finished the first year in a special needs school and is able to do things for himself. He is always neatly dressed, constantly smiling and happy. He is still classed as a disabled child, but we hope that in time he may be able to join his peers in a mainstream school and make a healthy young man. We will certainly try our best to help him achieve this. He is just one of the many children we are able to help thanks to the support of New Beginnings in the UK.
